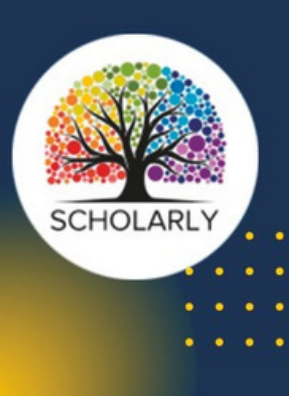

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SAT Exam FAQs

Question: How many times can I appear for the SAT Exam and what are the test dates and deadlines to apply?

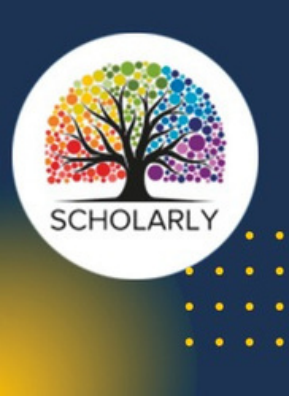
Answer: A student can appear for SAT as many times as he or she wants. The College Board recommends that students appear for the SAT at least twice. Some colleges consider the highest section-wise score (also called the super score) from all the tests that the student has appeared for. For international students, SAT test is usually organized six times during a year (March, May, June, August, October, and December). Please check the exact dates from the College Board website based on your location and preferred test center.

Question: What geographies consider SAT scores?

Answer: Most universities in the US consider SAT scores for admissions. Some US universities are test optional at this time, however providing a good score usually helps the application. Some of the top Canadian universities such as the University of Toronto, McGill University, University of Alberta and University of British Columbia also consider SAT scores. In the UK, some of the top ranked universities including the University of Oxford, University of Cambridge, University College London and University of Edinburgh consider SAT scores. More than 25 Indian universities including Ashoka, Flame, OP Jindal University and Shiv Nadar University consider SAT scores as a part of admission criteria.

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Question: Are SAT scores important for scholarships?

Answer: Yes, a high SAT score makes it easier to get a scholarship. However, colleges consider many other factors as well while awarding scholarships.

Question: Is the SAT optional for the USA?

Answer: Some of the top universities such as MIT and Georgia Tech require the SAT score. For many universities, SAT score is optional – so if your score is low, you can choose not to report. Few universities are test blind.

Question: What are the acceptable scores for Ivy League colleges?

Answer: For international students, the SAT score must be at least 1500 to have a chance of acceptance to the top universities. However, the SAT score is not the only criteria these universities consider for admissions.

Question: How much time does it take to prepare for the SAT?

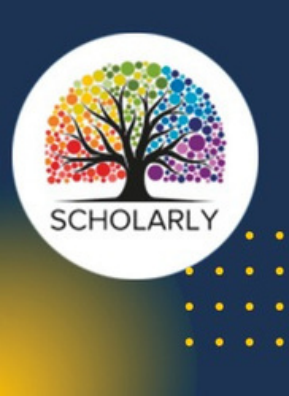
Answer: For most students that have completed class X, 45-60 days is sufficient to prepare for the test. Students may need more or less time depending on their academic level.

Question: How to register for the SAT exam and what is the registration fee?

Answer: You can register for the SAT test with the College Board [here](#). The registration fee varies by region, you can see the exact number [here](#). In 2022, the registration fee for Indian students was \$53.

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Question: In which grade should I give the SAT test?

Answer: You should appear for SAT when you are well prepared. Ideally, students should appear for the test during the 11th standard, giving them sufficient time for university applications.

Question: What is PSAT? When should I give the PSAT?

Answer: PSAT is colloquially known as the Preliminary SAT and is also called the NMSQT (National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test), is a simpler version of the SAT for high school students. These scholarships are awarded only to US students. For international students, this test is useful as they can opt for 'Student Search Service', which allows College Board to share some of your information with universities seeking students of your profile. This can help you in getting more information about universities and scholarships. This test is also a good practice of what to expect in the SAT.

Question: Are there any special allowances for students with disabilities in the SAT test?
